Pastor's Ponderings

Blessed New Year and Epiphany!

My name is Pastor Andrea Fluegel. I serve as a Transition Facilitator for the East Central Synod of Wisconsin. Over the next six months or so, I will be partnering with the Zion-Redeemer Councils, Transition/Ministry Site Profile Team and the Call Committee. I will also be working with other lay leaders. The purpose of a Transition Facilitator is to provide support, encouragement, and guidance to a congregation as they move forward in calling a new settled pastor. I also help congregations discern where and to whom God is calling them.



My current agreement is that I work with Zion-Redeemer Parish for twenty hours a month. I will mostly work behind-the-scenes and occasionally you will see me leading worship or at some congregational meetings. I am excited and blessed to be with you on this journey.

I am married to Erik and we have three children, two of whom are young adults and one is a junior in high school. We currently live in Eagle River, Wisconsin. I have been in ministry since 2000 in a variety of capacities, both lay staff and as an ordained pastor. I am also an ELCA Coach and Spiritual Director. I graduated from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota with a focus on congregational and mission development. My passion is walking alongside pastors and congregations. I love asking the questions, "What is God calling us to be and to do for the sake of God's world?" and "Where do we see the Holy Spirit working in this time and place?"

We are enthusiastically excited that our youngest will be playing the trombone in the Northwoods Band in the Rose Bowl Parade in Pasadena, California on January 2, 2023. (And maybe we are a little jealous that he will be in sunny California for the New Year.) There are eight school districts, 400 students and 58 adult chaperones (and six different flights and a semi-truck load of instruments) that form the Northwoods Band. It is one example of the many ways in which our rural communities share resources and gifts with each other. The Northwoods Band reminds me that community-spirit and generosity is what gives us strength, hope and beauty. The mission and ministry of Zion-Redeemer Parish is another example of this community-spirit and generosity in Jesus' name for the sake of all of God's creation.

The Apostle Paul wrote this in his Second Letter to the Corinthians, "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). He goes on to say that through Jesus we are reconciled to God and that we become ambassadors for Jesus. It's a beautiful reminder that through Jesus' divine love and grace, we move forward in life and that we are given this amazing gift of always being created new. That's the gift of

Jesus to each of us and to Zion-Redeemer Parish. This time of pastoral transition is a time when you, the people of God, are being created new so that you can be ambassadors for Jesus, sharing his divine love and grace with neighbors, strangers and those whom you will never meet. It's a beautiful mission that Jesus has called you into.

Guide all congregations in our East-Central Synod and across the United States who are also in this transition process. Fill us all with the breath of the Holy Spirit. In Jesus' divine love and grace. Amen.



December 8, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by President Paul Norrbom

Motion made by Mary Peterson, seconded by Lois Anderson, to approve the agenda. Carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The treasurer's report shows an account balance of \$72,378.90 as of November 30, 2022. Of that amount, \$38,316.46 is non-budget, and the budget has a balance of \$34,062.44. Motion made by Linda Evje, seconded by Tracy Dombeck, to approve the Treasurer's Report and the bills as presented to be paid. Carried. Council reviewed, discussed, and revised the 2023 Annual Budget (totaling \$89,061.60).

- Will discuss upkeep of cemetery gravestones at the annual meeting.

Worship/Music/Arts

- Pastors lined up through April 16th, 2023. (Thank you, Linda Evje!) Lay leaders will do Lenten worship services and possibly Good Friday.
- Songs have been selected.
- Will discuss with Zion the dates and times of Lenten services at Redeemer or at Zion. We plan on having soup and sandwich meals at 5:00—on Ash Wednesday and before the 6:30 p.m. services that will be held at Redeemer. (Possibly we will have Wednesday Lenten services at Redeemer on March 1 and 8 with services at Zion at 5:00 on March 15, 22, and 29. The Good Friday service will also be at Redeemer.)

Parish Education

- No Sunday School or confirmation Dec. 25 or Jan. 1.
- Raised \$87.58 at the November Noisy Coin Offering for Ana Luis, our Compassion International child. (Thank you, congregation!)
- Preparing for December 18th Christmas program.
- Bought Christmas presents for the youth.
- Starting on January 8, 2023, since times will switch with Zion for Redeemer worship at 10:30 a.m., the confirmation class will meet at Redeemer from 9:00-10:30 a.m. Sunday School stays at 9:30 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS

- Motion by Linda Evje, seconded by Lois Anderson to give final approval of the contract with Rev. Andrea Fluegel, our transition facilitator for a total of \$850 per month (\$425 per congregation) for 20 hours each month for 6 months (plus mileage). This was previously discussed and decided upon at a joint council meeting with Zion. We expect most work to be done virtually to save on mileage, with at least one meeting a month in person. The next joint meeting with Zion will be at Redeemer on January 10th at 5:00 p.m.
- Transition Process-Joint council/transition team met with Rev. Andrea Fluegel at Zion on Sunday Dec. 4th at 11:30 a.m. She recommended the CAT (Congregational Assessment Tool) survey for \$490 (Redeemer's share). After discussion and recommendation by the transition team members in attendance, motion was made by Clint Horne, seconded by Ann Hawley to purchase the survey tool. Motion passed with one "nay" vote.
- Elevator inspection process ATIS-inspected our elevator on Wednesday, Nov 16. Everything worked fine, but he said we should have OTIS come at least once a year for maintenance. The state also requires a fireman's service record every 3 months, but he showed Ann Hawley how to do it. She made a detailed list of what needs to be done with a sheet for someone (a trustee) to sign every 3 months (in the elevator room and outside the secretary's office on the bulletin board.) After OTIS comes, ATIS will be notified, and then they will OK us to get a certificate from the state. OTIS sent a new contract for \$65 a month payable annually before Jan. 1st. They will only have to come out once a year unless we have problems. (Original quote was \$110 a month including doing the fireman's inspections quarterly.) Motion by Lois Anderson, seconded by Linda Evje to approve \$65 a month for the contract with OTIS Elevator. Carried.
- \$150 spent for Homme Youth & Family Operation Christmas (3 artist kits & sketch pads, 12 games)
- Lois Anderson updated council on current status of the progress of the nominating committee. There are still openings for council secretary, one trustee, and one parish life member. Please contact Lois Anderson if interested in being part of the 2023 Council.

NEW BUSINESS

- New members: Stacy Olson & daughter Kaylee Baracca (4th grade) from Elderon area. Official welcome on Dec. 18th.
- Report on Crossways Camping Ministries Special Meeting for Delegates: Sat. Dec. 3, 10:00 a.m. (Voted on selling 3 acres of land that is not being used by Imago Dei Village to meet expenses, and Bylaws revision-change timeline of when Board officers are elected-prior to annual meeting in March instead of after the annual meeting to allow time for onboarding new officers and continuity in leadership.) Ann Hawley and Kim Timm Zoom meeting
- Cost of cemetery plot will remain at \$500. There was a question about plot 3, section 37. There is a large family stone on that plot (which was never purchased), but if a family member who will be cremated wants to be buried there, that's fine as long as they have a flat stone and pay for the plot.
- Committees, your summaries for the annual report are due Dec. 28th.

Next Meeting Date – Thursday, January 12th @ 5:30 pm Budget Meeting – January 15, 2023 and Annual Meeting – January 22, 2023

Boost Your Brain and Memory

The Boost Your Brain & Memory program by Mather Institute is unique because it takes a holistic approach to improving brain health and is evidenced based. The aim is to help participants implement new habits to maintain cognitive health while also practicing new skills for better memory performance.

The 8-week, 90-minute sessions will be offered at the Shawano County Department of Human Services Building in Room A115. The class will meet Wednesdays, January 11-March 1st 2023 from noon-1:30 p.m. Class size is limited to 12 participants. Lunch is included.

Announcing the CAT Survey

During this period of pastoral transition, the Zion-Redeemer Parish Councils and Transition/Ministry Site Profile Teams are taking intentional steps to prepare for the future. One of the steps needs the participation of all members and friends. We ask you to participate in a congregation-wide assessment to help inform the steps in calling a new pastor as well as the qualities our ministry needs in a pastor.

Beginning, Sunday, January 15, 2023, the Church Assessment Tool (CAT) will be open for all members and friends of Zion-Redeemer Parish, age 16 and up.

We have a goal of having <u>ALL members</u> complete the CAT. This includes:

- members who aren't currently worshiping; and
- friends and regular visitors who join us in worship, in-person or online.

The wider the participation, the more accurate information we will have to move forward in calling a new pastor.

The results of the CAT will provide helpful insight into the calling of a new pastor. Additionally, the assessment will provide us a clear readout on the health and trajectory of our congregation.

Your participation in the CAT will take about 20-25 minutes and needs to be completed in one sitting for the online version. Your responses are anonymous. No one will see your responses and know they are yours. If you lack online availability or need assistance, please contact the church office or a Transition/Ministry Site Profile Team member. Paper copies will be available. Paper copies are due in the office by Wednesday, January 25, 2023.

Once the results are received by the Councils, Transition/Ministry Site Profile Team and Call Committee members, the congregation will receive information over several weeks with bullet point results information.

We are confident your input into this important process will be fruit for the future of our parish. Please take the CAT survey and encourage your family and other members to take it as well. A link to the survey will be provided for you beginning on Sunday, January 15, 2023.

Report from Crossways Camps, December 2022

Wow! What a fantastic turnout on Saturday, December 3rd for our special Delegate meeting! (Ann Hawley & Kim Timm attended via Zoom for Redeemer.) We wanted to share a recap of the meeting and provide some plans for next steps as a result of what we heard during the discussion and listening session.

This special meeting was called specifically to discuss the sale of a three acre parcel of land at our Imago Dei Village site as recommended by the Crossways Board of Directors. Key discussion points included:

- A map of the parcel(s)
- A presentation from Jess Throlson, Director of Imago Dei Village regarding history and current usage of the parcel
- A presentation from Pastor Jenn Pockat, Board Treasurer regarding the status of Crossways projected FY22 Budget shortfall
- A discussion pertaining to our Crossways current cash position and concern for projected cash flow issues

The board recognizes that divesting of property is an emotional and permanent process. It was natural that questions arose regarding why the board chose to recommend selling this property versus engaging other options which the board had studied throughout 2022. To help explain this, many of the reasons are listed here:

- The initial expected deficit was over \$200,000 and additional fundraising or an appeal beyond the synod's \$50,000 matching grant and existing appeals were not considered sufficient to address this
- The Endowment Committee was approached but voted down liquidating any of that fund
- Land at Pine Lake and part of the 120 at Village were also considered, but staff thought the three-acre parcel was best as it had zero impact on programming
- The deficit was an immediate cash crisis and necessitated immediate action

While it is a sad loss, the sale of this property will mean that Crossways can pay its bills and avoid defaulting on its debt. In addition to the consideration and vote regarding the land sale, the Board shared a report composed by Don Johnson, National Director of Lutheran Outdoor Ministries (LOM) after a team of camp and conference/retreat experts interviewed stakeholders, staff and board members during an October, week-long visit to the Crossways sites. Key aspects of the LOM report included:

- People love Crossways but tend to identify with one particular site.
- Impactful ministry happens at all three sites.
- Crossways has people poised and ready to support the camps as volunteers through time, talent, and financial resources.
- Churches would like to see and hear more from the camps. There is a need to strengthen external communications.
- There is a sense of competition for resources between the camps. There is unnecessary "red tape" that can impede growth.
- There needs to be more clarity in roles and responsibilities of the year-round team.
- A great deal of hope was expressed about the ministry of each individual camp.

Thanks to the vibrant discussion at the meeting in consideration of the LOM assessment report and recommendations, the board is moving forward with some key initiatives aimed at building on our organizational strengths and addressing opportunities for growth.

- 1. The Board is working with staff on increased fundraising initiatives and new programs, marketing and recruiting aimed at developing new partners and client use of our sites.
- The Board is developing a plan to engage delegates, stakeholders, staff and customers in the process of building understanding and consensus around the mission, vision and core values of each of our camps. Listening sessions and conversations will take place in January 2023. Watch for more information including dates and details in early January.
- 3. During the first quarter of 2023, the Board will engage a Task Force to develop a new strategic plan for Crossways. We are seeking people to be involved in the process of creating the plan. This would be a commitment of 8-10 meetings over a 3-4 month period. If you are interested please reach out Interim Executive Director, Scott Merrow (scott@crosswayscamps.org)
- 4. Imbedded into the new strategic plan will be specific goals and actions addressing key areas such as:
 - a. Program Development for each site
 - b. Marketing & Promotions
 - c. Constituent Relations and Communication
 - d. Financial Development and Management
 - e. Staffing/Organizational Structure
 - f. Board Development
- 5. The staff will develop a specific 2-year operational plan to align with the strategic plan once approved.

Over the last few months, through listening sessions and thoughtful conversation we have heard – loud and clear – that you want to know more about what's happening at Crossways. We are committed to sharing timely, transparent information and encourage you to reach out to Board Members and/or staff to share your thoughts on this important ministry. We have also added a link to the homepage of our website so that you may easily reach out for information on getting involved; becoming a board member; or email the board with thoughts, questions, or comments. 
