- The goal is wholeness, connection and joy, and the world and those of us in it are wired for this.
- 10. We have everything we need, and would remember that, and live in that if we regularly stopped everything long enough to let God remind us.
- 11. The world is filled with beauty, infused with the light of God who holds us all.

#### God Rested....

By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating he had done. Genesis 2: 2-3

From the beginning, "resting" was a part of God's creating process. God took time to relax and enjoy what had been created. God stopped working. God relaxed. God looked around to take in the beauty of nature, the vast variety of creatures, the wonders everywhere! God took all that goodness in. Maybe God took a nap. Maybe God met with some of the animals and Adam and Eve to worship. Maybe God played. I don't know for sure, but I do know that the Bible tells us that God made this day holy! What does it mean for us to have one day of the week set aside for holiness?

In the third commandment, we are asked to remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy. Most of us worship on Sunday mornings, but busy schedules have led to other times as well. At our Pastors' theological retreat this past week, we spent time practicing "holy resting" - praying, singing, creating art, and enjoying God's living color in Door County!

Our speakers, a young Presbyterian clergy couple, Kara and Andrew Root, invited us to take seriously this theme of resting on the Sabbath. Stopping or ceasing work one day a week. Not producing! Not winning people over to our own way of thinking! Learning that living is not holy when it's all about ME! When is the last time you rested one whole day? Opened your eyes and ears to God's glory? Let your body relax and feel the goodness all around? Heard the sound of silence? Practiced, "Be still and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10?

In some ways Covid has slowed down our chasing, "on the go" practices. What might happen if we all take a whole day each week to stop, look, and listen – to wonder at God's holy creation, to notice that God is still creating? Please look at the chart in this newsletter. It compares a way of life led by "fear" to God's intended way of life taught to us since the beginning of time. Let's have conversations about this comparison. How lovely it would be to, as a church, help each other practice Sabbath! Change may happen which could be life-giving!!!!

#### **Duties of Council Members:**


- Commit to attending council meetings usually held the second Thursday of each month at 5:30 p.m. in the church basement
- Be on one of the committees (Education; Worship/Music/Arts; Parish Life; Trustees) which meet approximately four times a year.

#### **Duties of Committees:**

- **Education**: in charge of Sunday School, confirmation, youth programming, Vacation Bible School, and adult education/Bible study.
- Worship/Music/Arts: responsible for planning, review and supervision of the worship program of the
  congregation, working together with the pastor, organist(s), choir director, and others. The committee will secure
  organists, choir directors, substitute pastor/preachers, and additional persons needed for assistance in the
  congregation's worship life (acolytes, altar guild, readers, ushers, communion servers, etc.) and train volunteers
  when necessary.
- Parish Life: serves as the executive committee of the Church Council and as advisors to the pastor, providing pastoral supervision and evaluation. The committee will review, plan, and supervise the congregation's efforts and responsibilities in the areas of evangelism and stewardship.
- **Trustees**: responsible for the legal and corporate affairs of the congregation and care and maintenance of the physical property of the church.

## **Youth News:**

- Thank you to the parents for bringing your children to Sunday School 9:30 on Sunday mornings, and now confirmation is at Zion from 3:30-5:00 pm.
- First Communion class (for grades 4-6) is tentatively scheduled for Thursday December 9th after school and Saturday December 11th. First communion will be on Sunday December 12th.
- Thank you so much to the students who enlivened our worship service on October 17th by helping greeters, ushers, readers, performing using instruments, and passing buckets for Noisy Coin Sunday. (There was a total of \$106. 27 from the Noisy Coin and Sunday School offering for Anna Luis, our Compassion International child from Mexico.) Three students who didn't receive a Bible last year were presented with a Bible on the 17th (Rinny Buntrock, Carson Rosenow, and Claire Rosenow).
- National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis, MN July 24-28, 2022 "Boundless-God Beyond Measure" for 8-12th graders. (Students must be in high school or moving into H.S. in 2022.)

  We need to decide soon who is going so that we can plan how the church will help financially (probably matching funds) and what kind of fundraising will be necessary! We will find a way to help all youth who want to get there for a reasonable cost! Please read all about it ASAP on the ELCA website. ELCA Youth Gathering (www.elca.org/YouthGathering/About/Overview) Learn about the program, costs, deadlines, and safety. The cost for the program is \$350 and \$40 per night for the hotel (3 nights), plus food and transportation. The Synod has some financial assistance. Two chaperones will need expenses paid. This will involve families raising funds and congregational support. A gift from JoAnn Innerebner's memorial fund has been offered for this event in connection with a matching funds challenge. Other ideas welcome! Please call Pastor Sharon if you have any questions.


# Communion
