"C.S. Lewis is one of my favorite authors. He is most famous as a lay theologian and apologist for Christianity.

While he wrote on many topics, Lewis' most popular writings are in a series of books for children with a Christian subtext, called *The Chronicles of Narnia*. The first book introduces four children who, by means of a magic clothes wardrobe, are transported to the Land of Narnia. There they meet the great lion, Aslan—the central character of the whole series, and Lewis' version of what Jesus might have been in a different world.

In the second book, the children—who are just a year older—are called back to Narnia. When the children meet up with the lion again, one of the children remarks "Aslan...you're bigger!"

To which he responds, "That's because you're older, little one."

The child insists, "Isn't it because you *are* bigger?" And Aslan explains: "I'm not. But each year <u>you</u> grow, you will find me bigger."

Each year as I grow, I will find the Christ figure bigger. At Christmas in particular, we are called to discover that as <u>we</u> mature spiritually, we will find more depth and breadth in the person of Jesus. It is not because the Son of God can grow, of course, but because my capacity to receive him has improved. There will always be more Jesus than we can comprehend... more Christ to grow into... more Savior with whom we can form a richer relationship.

As much as anyone, I delight in the joy of Christmas—human affection done up in decorations, sweets, and gift giving. I am pleased that Christian, and truly human, themes of charity and kindness catch on just about everywhere in December.

However, perhaps our predicaments go a lot deeper than the likes of the Grinch, and that the milk of human kindness alone can manage. Perhaps what we need is not more repetitions of "The Little Drummer Boy", but the stillness to hear the beat of God's heart in time with our own... the voices of the prophets telling us of the world as God wants it to be. Perhaps we should aim for a deeper awareness of the unending generosity of God, whose presence we can

never outgrow."

#### PASTOR'S REPORT Contracted Pastor Sharon Fox-Bogen

- Made homebound visits and phone calls.
- Pastor Sharon will start a grief group in January, possibly meeting at Redeemer. So far 17 people from Redeemer and Zion have expressed an interest in attending. Pastor Sharon will start leading it. It can be open to the public. The cost for materials will be paid by each participant, and is \$10.00.

- Motion by Linda Evje, seconded by Judy Boda to use money received from the fall luncheon and basket raffle to purchase Angels from the Homme Home Angel Appeal for our members who are residents of Homme or in Rainbow and Carbonaro Apartments or Rennes in Schofield and also to apply some money toward purchase of some Christmas gifts for Homme Youth and Family Services. Motion passed.

Meeting held at Redeemer Church in Wittenberg at 5:30 p.m. Agenda:

- 1. Reviewed what was discussed at each of the meetings with Pastor Asher O'Callaghan and Pastor Dara Clifford. It was discovered that different things were discussed at our separate meetings. It appears that in the future, meeting with Synod staff need to be **joint meetings only** to avoid discrepancies. Neither of us received positive feedback on the search for a Pastor for our Parish.
- 2. Discussed Parish Agreement Decided to have the Advisory Council go through the document and suggest changes, if any. The Advisory Council consists of the President, Treasurer, and 2 other members from each church. After the Advisory Council goes over the agreement, it will be presented to each council for approval.
- 3. Reviewed Pastor Sharon Fox Bogen's contract on visitations, funerals and memorial services. She receives \$50 per hour plus mileage at the annual IRS rate. Paul Norrbom will contact Pastor Sharon to see if she wishes to continue this contract with our Parish. Both councils were in agreement on continuing with Pastor Sharon.
- 4. The President of Redeemer, Paul Norrbom, and the President of Zion, Gary Thompson, will compose a letter and then send it to Bishop Anne Edison-Albright lifting up Pete Krolow for the TEEM program. Motion by Paul Pehlke 2<sup>nd</sup> by Linda Evje.




