To help you learn to love God more and more, check out this list of Bible stories. Read out loud and share reactions with others! **The Bible is like God's Valentines wishes for you every single day!**

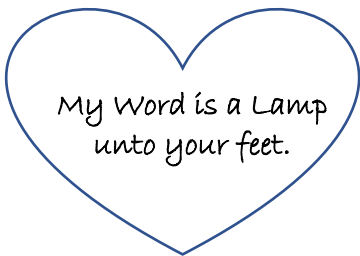

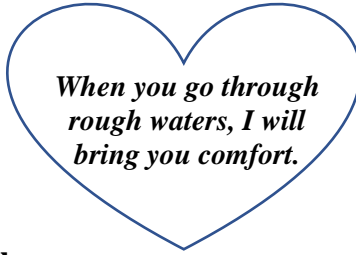

Greater Wausau Christian Services

Hebrews 13:3 Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them, and those who are mistreated, since you also are in the body.

Psalm 69:33 For the Lord hears the needy and does not despise his own people who are prisoners.

Psalm 34:18 The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.

Greater Wausau Christian Services is a non-profit organization supported by fourteen area churches (mostly Lutheran). Its purpose is to bring the basic gospel message to those in need. Usually about two-hundred fifty people a month are ministered to through Bible studies at the Marathon County Jail, the Juvenile Delinquency Center, and major nursing homes in the Wausau area (though some of these Bible studies had to be discontinued for a while because of the pandemic). Upon request, bibles are provided at no cost to the inmates at the County Jail and Delinquency Center. Each of the Life Recovery Bibles cost \$15 with about 15-30 given out monthly. Area pastors, lay pastors, and lay people volunteer to do the bible studies for Greater Wausau Christian Services, so the basic expenses are the salary for the director, Ray Slatton (who is also the county jail chaplain) and the cost of the bibles.

Greater Wausau Christian Services helped to found “Open Door” which provides donated interview clothes, family support group meetings, and educational services to those recently released from jail. It is located in the back of St. Paul’s Lutheran Church, downtown Wausau.

Kid’s Kount is another program supported by Greater Wausau Christian Services. Kid’s Kount collects gifts for children of those incarcerated in the Marathon County Jail at Christmas time.

My brother-in-law, Richard Hawley, is a lay pastor and the representative from Trinity Lutheran Church in Stettin for Greater Wausau Christian Services. He is also their current president. He states, “I have done a bible study in the county jail. There are people in the jail looking for hope, a second chance and meaning in their lives. God’s word provides that hope—an anchor in their lives when all seems lost. I hope that Redeemer Lutheran will join GWCS again in our effort to bring God’s love to those in need.”

I know there are many worthwhile organizations that would appreciate our donations, especially during this pandemic. This one is near to my heart because of the stories that my brother-in-law has told me about encounters with those incarcerated. They do so much for a forgotten segment of society. If you feel moved to make a donation, you can make a check out to Redeemer “for” Greater Wausau Christian Services. I will match any donations given in the month of February up to a total of \$100 (so the goal is \$200). Grief is not an event that begins and ends. It becomes part of your life. It is an active, ongoing process of turning your sadness into a meaningful life again. Grief can affect your body, mind and spirit. We'll help you understand why you may feel that no one understands. Grief can also change your life depending upon various factors including your internal coping skills, your stress tolerance, and your outlook on life. In this 5-week series, we'll discuss the 5 major changes you likely weren't expecting when your loved one died and share ways to cope. Accepting the changes doesn't happen immediately. Life can be brighter and better than you imagined. Death has a way of changing you, but healing your grief has a way of finding the bright spot in living again after loss. Our experienced facilitators offers education about what to expect and the group offers companionship and understanding from others who have also experienced loss.

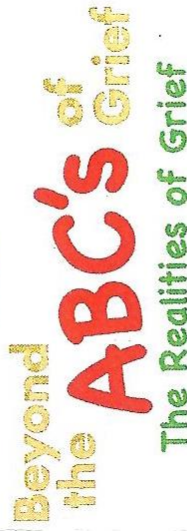


We invite you to our Open-Microphone ZOOMGRIEF session that allows you to express your thoughts, ask questions, share your challenges, and feel a connection with others going through grief just like you. In this session, the facilitator, Nan Zaastrow will encourage you to share your grief, listen to the stories others want to tell, and share your own experiences.

Participants will be asked to honor confidentiality, be non-judgmental and respect each other's feelings so this can be a safe place to talk. This is not a counseling session—and we won't be giving advice. It's a time for you to speak openly about what hurts and what helps. Facilitation may include guided questions to create conversation and each session will conclude with an inspirational thought or healthy grieving tips.

Don't grieve alone and keep your anxieties and fears bottled up inside. Discover how others are finding their way through grief. The goal of this session is to change the dark moments into hope and happiness again. We can do this together.

Grieving is different today. We are more aware of death and its consequences because of exposure to media. The new generation of bereaved are more willing to talk about grief's impact on their lives. The basics remain the same and you may think you have figured out. You understand that grief is a process, it takes time, and it hurts. What more do you need to know? What about the "gray" side of grief that isn't often talked about and those who grieve may hesitate to mention?

This series goes beyond the myths and the artificial phrases meant to comfort you.
