Pastor's Ponderings

"Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen." - Ephesians 3:20-21 (NRSVUE)

Dear Siblings in Christ,



The month of February moves us from the season of Epiphany to the season of Lent. We bury the "Alleluia." We no longer say, shout, or sing "Alleluia" until Easter Vigil Saturday or Easter Sunday. "The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back at least to the fifth century in the western church. The custom of actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages. The hymn "Alleluia, song of gladness' (Evangelical Lutheran Worship #318) contains a translation of an 11th century Latin text that compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The text then anticipates the joy of Easter when glad alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor" (*Why Don't We Use Alleluias During Lent*, ELCA blog).

Lent is also a time to refocus, re-center and reconnect with the Triune God and each other. Giving up stuff during Lent is supposed to help us avoid distractions so that we can focus on God's work instead. Practices such as almsgiving (giving to those in need), fasting, and prayer (especially self-examination and confession) are traditionally used during this time of year. Silence is also a Lenten practice. Some people "give up" noise for Lent by turning off the television, social media, radios/podcasts to refocus on reading the Bible or devotionals, or just to sit in silence and pray or meditate.

What if this Lent instead of "giving up" alcohol or chocolate or caffeine, we gave? What if we gave ourselves permission to create, to imagine, and to play? How often do you reconnect with God through dance, painting, knitting, making prayer beads, woodworking? How often lately have you connected with others through play or service? What if we gave our time to God with silence or intentionally participating more in worship or other spiritual practices such as Centering Prayer, Daily Examen, Dwelling in the Word or Meditation? How often do you connect with yourself and God by taking a few minutes a day to intentionally focus on your breathing?

If you would like to explore these practices more, I highly recommend "Holy Solitude" by Heidi Haverkamp, "Happy Now" by Courtney Ellis, and "Sabbath" by Wayne Muller.

As Zion-Redeemer Parish continues to discern the direction that God is calling you into by the love of Jesus and in the boldness of the Holy Spirit, take time to reconnect with the Triune God,

with others, and with yourself. Laugh, play, create, imagine. God created us for these things too. Creativity and imagination frees us and opens us up to hear God's voice and calling. It helps us to discover and explore who we are as the gathered people of God.

Thank you to all of you who participated in the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT). Your input is needed to discern God's calling for Zion-Redeemer. The Council and Transition/Ministry Site Profile Team and Call Committee will be meeting with Kurt Jacobson from Mustard Seed Consulting on Sunday, February 19 to discuss the results from the CAT indepth. Once that is completed, the results will be shared with the parish over several weeks so that they are manageable and understandable. This information will guide the completion of the Ministry Site Profile and in ministry planning for the Council and various teams/committees.

What can you do? Being well informed and actively participating in the life and ministry of Zion-Redeemer Parish propels the ministry that God has called you to do for the sake of God's world. Please reach out to Council members with constructive questions, ideas, and thoughts. Continue to pray for Zion-Redeemer Parish, for its leadership, the pastor that God is calling to partner with you in ministry, and for the direction that God is calling you together.

Psalm 69:33 For the Lord hears the needy and does not despise his own people who are prisoners.Psalm 34:18 The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.

Greater Wausau Christian Services is a non-profit organization supported by eleven area churches (mostly Lutheran). Its purpose is to bring the basic gospel message to those in need. Usually about two-hundred fifty people a month are ministered to through Bible studies at the Marathon County Jail, the Juvenile Delinquency Center (restarting there soon), and major nursing homes in the Wausau area. Upon request, bibles are provided at no cost to the inmates at the County Jail and Delinquency Center. Each of the Life Recovery Bibles cost \$15 with about 15-30 given out monthly. Area pastors, lay pastors, and lay people volunteer to do the bible studies for Greater Wausau Christian Services, so the basic expenses are the salary for the director, Ray Slatton (who is also the county jail chaplain), an administrative assistant, office expenses, and the cost of the bibles.

Greater Wausau Christian Services helped to found "Open Door" which provides donated interview clothes, family support group meetings, and educational services to those recently released from jail. It is located in the back of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, downtown Wausau.

Kid's Kount is another program supported by Greater Wausau Christian Services. Kid's Kount collects gifts for children of those incarcerated in the Marathon County Jail at Christmas time.

My brother-in-law, Richard Hawley, is a lay pastor and the representative from Trinity Lutheran Church in Stettin for Greater Wausau Christian Services. He is also their current president. He states, "I have done a bible study in the county jail. There are people in the jail looking for hope, a second chance and meaning in their lives. God's word provides that hope-an anchor in their lives when all seems lost. I hope that Redeemer Lutheran will join GWCS again in our effort to bring God's love to those in need."

I know there are many worthwhile organizations that would appreciate our donations. This one is near to my heart because of the stories that my brother-in-law has told me about encounters with those incarcerated. They do so much for a forgotten segment of society. If you feel moved to make a donation, you can make a check out to Redeemer "for" Greater Wausau Christian Services. I will match any donations given in the month of February up to a total of \$100 (so the goal is \$200). 
