Pastor's Ponderings

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Lenten blessings!

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you to each and every one of you who completed the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT). 106 people over the age of 16 years old participated. Over the next several weeks, there will be a bulletin insert with results from the CAT regarding church satisfaction, worship, hospitality, faith formation, etc. These inserts will also be available by contacting the church office or by the entrance to the sanctuary. At a glance:

Participants in the C.A.T.

- 35 - Zion
- 53 - Redeemer
- 18 - Did not indicate
- 106 - Total respondents



Key Indicators about Zion-Redeemer Parish:

- One-third of members are satisfied with things in the church; 60% are unsure.
- 26% of respondents to the CAT indicate they worship less than 5 times per year or never.
- 39% agree that participation in activities beyond worship is very meaningful to them.
- Members can envision a more vital church than they are currently experiencing. Energy & morale is low.
- The parish has a conservative theological stance, with low diversity among members.
- 2/3 of respondents say their spirituality/faith is really the basis of their whole approach to life.

Key Transition Insights

- Members are comfortable with the timing of the pastoral transition and feel it is time for this change.
- 1/2 of members are unsure if the church should continue in the same direction it has taken in the recent past. 1/4 believe it should. Conversation congregation-wide should ensue on future direction.

- A leadership style of pastor that would best fit Zion-Redeemer Parish would include the characteristics of delegating authority, assigning responsibility and recognizing the contributions of others; Making changes very slowly by working patiently to insure ownership of the final result.

Members see these abilities as critical for the next pastor: (in rank order)

- Preaching that inspires and connects people to God’s word.
- Pastoral care – capacity to engage people empathetically & care for persons in times of need.
- Strategic leadership – casting a vision and leading the church toward realization of the vision.

What to do with this information?

This information will be used to help write the Ministry Site Profile. It also will help the Parish Council, Zion Council, Redeemer Council and other ministry teams begin to work on strategic planning, goals and priorities, and ways to develop energy and ministry opportunities for the congregation.

It’s also incredibly important that you get involved in the life of the congregation inside and outside of the church building. A congregation thrives when voices are heard and everyone gets involved. Use the season of Lent to discover your gifts and passions. Unfortunately, the weather was less than cooperative for people to participate in Ash Wednesday worship across the Midwest. However, one of the learnings from COVID is how to pivot quickly. Congregations came up with a variety of ways to still recognize and practice our faith traditions. Zion and Redeemer posted on Facebook a variety of resources for you to participate in Ash Wednesday at home in order to assist you and your family in connecting with Christ. The season of Lent is about finding ways to connect and reconnect with the Trinity and with others in the congregation and in the community through worship and service. This is our hope as congregations that people and families will connect with the Trinity and with others throughout the year. We want all people to experience the love and grace of Jesus. In order to do this in today’s world, congregations will need to continuously pivot while holding dear our traditions, rituals, and beliefs. It is quite a challenge. Congregations can no longer just “maintain.” We are called to be flexible, adaptive and innovative in order to share Jesus’ love with the world. This Lent, how can you share Jesus’ love with others?

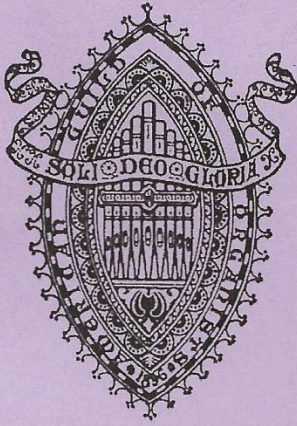
