## **Pastor's Ponderings**

"So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid." - Mark 16:8

Dear Siblings in Christ,

He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!



It's always exciting to shout "Alleluia" on Easter morning after what feels like the long season of Lent. Easter Day is exciting, especially for children. We get dressed up, have special meals, hunt for Easter eggs (sometimes in the snow), and play. Yet, Easter is so much more than all the festivities. It is a day of joy in sharing the Good News of Jesus with others.

The Gospel of Mark says that the women were terrified and amazed when they went to Jesus' tomb and saw it empty. And their reaction was to say nothing. That's where the Gospel of Mark ends. If they witnessed the empty tomb and said nothing, how then did word of the resurrection of Jesus spread throughout the world and throughout history? Yet, we know that the witnesses to the empty tomb shared the story.

Paula Gooder in her book "This Risen Existence: The Spirit of Easter" writes: "If Jesus was risen from the dead and no one said anything about it, would that undermine the power of his rising from the dead?" She goes on to explain that it is a complicated answer. It is both "yes" and "no" (yes, we as Lutherans love to live in paradox - saint and sinner, law and gospel, here and not yet.) Gooder answers her question by stating, "Yes, it would reduce the power of the resurrection because God in his great and unfathomable generosity has seen fit to trust us to communicate the things of God in the world. If we choose not to then of course this will detract from the worder of the event." The Apostle Paul was also concerned with the urgency and importance of sharing the Good News. In Romans 10:14 he asks how people will believe if they have not heard.

Of course, there is another answer to this question about what would happen if no one said anything about the empty tomb and the resurrection of Jesus. Gooder continues, "It is important to recognize that even if the women had said nothing, ever, to anyone, Jesus would still be risen, the resurrection would still have happened, death and sin would still be defeated." Even if the disciples met the resurrected Jesus in Galilee and still said nothing and "even if we decide never to take up the challenge to 'go, tell,' God will still be God and Jesus will still be risen. God invites our engagement in his divine plan but does not need it. Failure of nerve on the part of human beings does not ruin God's presence in the world."

Even though God is still God and Jesus is still risen and that will never change, God still calls us to share the Good News of Jesus's love with others. God trusts us to communicate where God/Jesus/Holy Spirit are working in our lives and in the world. As the people of God we are called to be Jesus' love in action. By doing so we are shouting "He is Risen. He is Risen Indeed. Alleluia!" for all to hear, see, taste, and feel Jesus' love. It is by our response to Jesus' love in our own lives and sharing that same love to overflowing in the lives of others that we become Jesus' love in action.



What has God gifted you with that you can share with others? Even though the women were afraid at first and told no one about Jesus' empty tomb, eventually someone did tell and look what happened!

## 2023 Crossways Camping Ministries Annual Meeting

Saturday, March 11, 2023 at St. Mark's Lutheran Church, Neenah Delegates: Miriam Nelson and Ann Hawley

Scott Merrow, Crossways Interim Executive Director, gave a positive report on camp for 2022. The number of campers is coming back (over 2,000 this past year), but it's not back to pre-CoVid numbers yet. Congregations can help by encouraging children, families, and adults to attend one of the camping programs. There are day camps for children as young as kindergarten. For more information on the three camps (Waypost by Bevent, Imago Dei by Clintonville, and Pine Lake by Waupaca), check out their website at <u>www.crosswayscamps.org</u>.

Crossways initiatives this year include 1: improved communications (surveys and zoom sessions), 2: continued up-to-date financial reporting, 3: marketing and Ambassadors (trained people to talk to congregations and youth groups to share information about camp), and 4: strategic planning.

The camp directors shared information about the camp opportunities. Jess from Imago Dei talked about the camps for students in grades 2-12. Robin and Ben from Pine Lake said that family camps offer time, space, and activities to make sharing faith intentional. They thanked the volunteers who helped stain, paint, and clean the camps. Camp supporters helped make the renovation of the Pine Lake Chapel possible in 2022. If anyone is interested in being a camp counselor, you will learn life-long skills: problem-solving, public speaking, teamwork, people skills—and it will look great on your resume. Andrew from Waypost stated that there are a number of camps and retreats throughout the year. Camps are also available for rentals (including family reunions and celebrations.) There is Day Camp at Pine Lake for grades K-5. New this year is a 4-day self-determination camp for adults (age 15-40) with intellectual disabilities. Imago Dei has a jr/sr high leadership camp with service projects. Through Waypost, there will be a backpacking camp in the Porcupine Mountains in July. All of the locations have confirmation camps. (Andrew Templeton, Waypost Director recently accepted a position as executive director of a camp in California, so they are looking for a replacement for him.)

Rev. Rich Block, the new Board President, stated that Crossways received a gift of \$70,000 from Grace Lutheran in Appleton since they closed. There was also a \$20,000 gift from Incarnation Church in Green Bay who also closed. It's unfortunate that the churches closed, but Crossways appreciated being remembered through their legacy gifts. There was also a donation of a 15-passenger van. This year Crossways will also receive almost \$78,000 from employee retention credit (final CoVid funds from businesses affected from the pandemic.) That revenue will help make up most of the projected deficit-at least for 2023. Congregations can be informed of estate planning opportunities-so Crossways can be included in their wills. Also the Spring Appeal will be coming soon. Action Packs were distributed so informational packets could be displayed at churches. If anyone is interested in being a Camp Champ to volunteer and distribute information, sign up at www.crosswayscamps.org/champs.

Chris Beloin from Thrivent discussed Choice Dollars (which members need to designate by the end of March) and Thrivent Action Teams (\$250 towards projects for associate members and \$500 for full members.) The form is easy to fill out to apply for these Thrivent grants. It costs \$20 a year to be an associate member.

Rev. Jen Pockat, the Finance Committee Chair, discussed the 2023 budget, which was approved (with a projected deficit of \$39,000. Expenses will total \$1,159,957.) She thanked the Synod for their end-of-the year matching grant of \$50,000 and the donors who helped us match that for a total of \$100,000 in 2022. The 3 acres next to Imago Dei Village hasn't been sold yet that was approved for sale at the December zoom meeting. Expenses went up about 10% due to inflation and increased cost of insurance even though there was a smaller summer staff. A \$30,000 line of credit was paid off in 2022.

The staff at Crossways Camping Ministries were thanked for their dedication and hard work this past year. The slate of Board members was approved unanimously. (\*<u>Redeemer has money available for kids to attend camp</u>.)


