Faith Leads to Action; See You at Worship

Congratulations to our newly confirmed students at both churches! Now what? You finished your studies, so you are done studying God's - ahhh - no! Sunday School is ending, so our young families can take the summer off from worship. That's like not eating. Please don't do that. It is true that we are busy and need our recreation time. Yes, Wisconsin has a very short season to "go to the lake"; but I hope you worship wherever you go - in a church or in the great outdoors. Tend to your Spirit as you sit at a campfire, go fishing or hiking, or relax under the sun. Be intentional about praising God and feeling God's power in your life.

Martin Luther preached that our faith life is lived out in these 4 vocations: **Family, Work, Church, and Community.** That means we are doing the will and the work of God as we parent and grandparent in ways that honor our children. Providing them with education, medical care; nurturing them with **family** and friend opportunities; making time for meaningful conversations even though we are all busy people! This is a reminder that hearing God's Word on a regular basis will help each of these efforts and teach our children to grow up doing the same!

We also serve God wherever we **work** as we use our gifts/talents from God to do good in the world. Balancing work and family and church can be quite a challenge. Often, the Word of God helps you prioritize these demands and even find joy in your service! Martin Luther reminds us to do each task to the best of our ability without complaining, grateful for the opportunity to contribute to society. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we can gain strength as we learn from the family of God how best to love and honor our colleagues and the people we serve.

Our **community** organizations need our support, too! By virtue of our baptism, we are to be involved in civic concerns: serving on an education board or local town meeting, and doing our part to follow basic rules of law and order, safety and care of property and our environment. God's Will is that we speak up for those who have no voice and use our abilities to support lifegiving projects like voting, and feeding the hungry, providing housing, and speaking in respectful ways to get God's work of peace and justice done. Jesus led the way in how to act in ways that lead to a healthy and whole community. People of faith can lead the way today!

Each of the 3 vocations above plus **church** move **faith to action!** I believe that this faith comes alive by living in the natural cycle of creation, taught by God. God rested on the seventh day!

We, too, need to rest and refresh our souls weekly! Please make time to regularly listen to God's word, for it is Scripture and God's love stories that make Christianity come alive. I hope and pray that we all want that for our teens, for our children, and for ourselves! God's work happens everywhere, and we pray that we are a part of it. Ephes 2:10 For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life. Your church will help you live out your faith in all 4 vocations! Be the church wherever you are and know that regular worship will feed you for the journey! We are the church!

Motion made by Linda Evje, seconded by Lois Anderson, to donate \$200.00 raised during the Lenten Soup and Sandwich Suppers to the Wittenberg Food Pantry's Student Food Backpacks program. Carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- Planned Sunday worship services as well as Lent and Holy week that were led by her and our Lay Leaders.
- Finishing up Confirmation classes. Taught baptism and made stoles with bible verses.
- Made homebound visits and phone calls.
- Led Wednesday and Thursday Bible studies.
- Updated Council on her recent vacation in March.

NEW BUSINESS



Community Giving

Bring these items to church by May 8th so our reps can take them to the Synod Assembly on May 13-14. Donations may be made out to the East Central Synod of Wisconsin marked "SHP" and made on the synod website, www.ecsw.org Redeemer Lutheran has given \$500.00 collected from generous Thrivent Fund donations to support this program.

WB Weekend Backpack Program



The Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District along with the Wittenberg Food Pantry has implemented a backpack program which provides nutritional, easy-to-prepare food for students in families that are struggling to have food needs met over the weekends during the school year. Pantry volunteers fill backpacks that students take home Friday and return on Monday. There are over 40 students enrolled in this program and the cost of feeding each one is about \$100 per year.

Redeemer Lutheran has donated \$200.00 collected from the Lenten Soup/Sandwich donations to support this program.


