

Pastor's Ponderings

Dear People of Easter and Pentecost,

The saying goes, “April showers bring May flowers.” However, recently I saw a social media post that said, “April showers bring May snow ‘plowers.” I certainly hope that the snow plows and snow plow drivers can have a much needed Sabbath. While the month of May is a little more predictable than the month of April in terms of weather, the month of May in the life of the Church is full with blessings, new creation, and uncertainty as we move from the Empty Tomb of Easter Resurrection to the wind strongly

blowing and tongues of fire on Pentecost fifty days later. The followers of Jesus moved from being disciples to being apostles (“the sent out ones”). There was indeed a lot of uncertainty and doubt during the transition from Easter to Pentecost for the followers of Jesus.

Even in their uncertainty during transition, there were glimmers and shimmers of hope, direction, and calling. One of my favorite verses from the Book of Acts shows this movement of hope:

“Awe came upon everyone because many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved” (Acts 2:43-47).

I love these verses because the followers of the resurrected Jesus trusted in their calling to mission and ministry. There was unity (despite differences of economics, politics, experiences, education, nationality, gender, ethnicity, etc.) among them. They worked together in one direction - their mission and ministry. They ate together. Potluck anyone? They ate together with glad and generous hearts - we call this Holy Communion. They praised God together. They took care of each other and those in the larger community by giving what they were able. And the Lord added to their numbers.



While this isn't an exact recipe for growing church membership numbers, it does give us a glimpse into the mission and ministry of Jesus. There was energy in everyone working together toward a common mission. There was energy in everyone being together with glad and generous hearts praising God. And that energy spilled and overflowed into how they engaged the larger community. They wanted everyone to know the love and grace of Jesus. They showed that through acts of service, radical hospitality, generosity and inclusivity.

For us, as followers of Jesus, as the apostles of today, how do we live into the mission and ministry of Jesus, even amidst the transitions of pastoral ministry and the transitions in our own lives? How do we live with glad and generous hearts? How do we live out acts of service to the larger community, showing radical hospitality, generosity and inclusivity? How do we do more than just invite the neighbor into the church building but see everyone as a beloved child of God, our brothers and sisters? How does all of this deepen our faith life and our relationship with Jesus?

How do you move from being a people of Easter to a people of Pentecost?

TREASURER'S REPORT

The treasurer's report was perused by the council. Motion made by Kim Timm, seconded by Linda Evje, to approve the Treasurer's Report and the bills as presented to be paid. Carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT Contracted Pastor Sharon Fox-Bogen

- Ann Hawley noted she and Pastor Sharon met in person, and Pastor Sharon said she was making visits and phone calls. Pastor Sharon does have the new forms developed by council to help her track her visits and hours.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parish Life

- Parish Life will organize and run a Charity Rummage Sale and Bake Sale during the May 6th Wittenberg Area Rummage Sale weekend from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm.
- Parish Life will plan and construct a float for the Wittenberg Community Days. We will collaborate with Zion on this float.
- A Bible Study will start for interested adults on April 16th during the 9:30 to 10:30 Sunday school time. This study will run until Sunday school ends in the spring.
- A motion was made by Paul Pehlke and seconded by Sandy Lang to utilize money from the Bazaar fund to purchase items needed for both the fall rummage sale and Community Days float. Carried
- Easter Blessings cards were sent out to our homebound members.

Trustees

- The elevator permit has our elevator up to date until August 28, 2023. Jeff Lang mounted two fire extinguishers in places suggested by Apex.
- Trustees have contacted Appleton Marble and Granite concerning refurbishing stones in our cemetery. Once snow is gone, Trustees will make an appointment with a representative to walk the cemetery noting stones that need to be fixed. They will get an estimate for work needing to be completed as suggested by the company.
- Jeff and Sandy Lang picked up brush. They have some youth who may be interested in shoveling the stairway next winter. Details will be discussed next fall.

Worship/Music/Arts

- Linda continues to schedule supply Pastors, and we are booked through August.
- Easter was well attended. .

- We will utilize the Liturgy of Joy service from May to September on the Sundays Rev. Rendall is with us.

Parish Education

- We received thank you notes from Homme Youth & Family Programs, Homme Foundation, Wittenberg Food Pantry, and Crossways Camping Ministries for donations sent from Redeemer.
- Thank you to Mary Peterson and her crew for another successful, delicious Easter breakfast.
- We are looking at June 25th and August 13th for joint Zion-Redeemer Church picnics this summer. June 25th would be in Wittenberg at Washington Park with a 9:30 joint service and pot luck to follow. August 13th would be at Zion with a pot luck meal/picnic outside the church following the 10:00 a.m. worship.
- A \$2,200 donation was received from Patricia Schultz and family in honor of her brother, Dennis L. Thorson, who passed away in March 2022. She has requested the money be used to purchase something to enhance our worship. Council will look at various suggestions in the upcoming months.
