### Peace Be unto You! Pastor Sharon

In every generation, the world cries for peace! This Memorial Day and 4<sup>th</sup> of July, I will join you in singing and celebrating our America's claim to be a land of peace. The Bible speaks often of peace - not the peace that the world gives, but the peace of God that passes all understanding!

Our text several weeks ago was from John 14. Perhaps these words from Jesus recorded in vs 27 are still resonating in your ears and hearts: *Peace, I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.* 

There are plenty of reasons in this world to fret and worry and fear, but Jesus says to us, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." Not an easy request of humans: not for the disciples then nor for us today in our current world - so full of violence – horrendous deaths and destruction in Ukraine and in our local schools! We ask for peace in all circumstances: abroad and in our little corner of the world! Along with Redeemer and Zion, I will walk with you in our own death as we prepare to change pastoral leadership in this parish. Peace is what we want; change and uprooting is what we get - for now.

We might think peace means settled and all is well; but the God of creation shows us abundantly more than we can fathom - endless changes that continue to intrigue and astound us! God, in Jesus, by his life, death and resurrection, surprises us that dying to the old can lead to rising to new life. What the disciples think is the end becomes a new beginning! And as God lives among us in Holy Spirit form, a new church is born. This church keeps coming alive as it grows world-wide, as it changes for the sake of all people. Gathered into one body by the Spirit, our call is still to welcome all people- believers and non-believers into this one body in Christ! How will the Holy Spirit ignite the gifts of our parish in new and exciting or challenging ways? God's kingdom of peace is always on the move....and we pray that we are part of what is to come!

It is a time to listen closely to God, to hear what God is wanting us to end or to begin so that God can work new life in our church and in the lives of our members and cities! It is a time for good-byes and gratitude. It is a time for evaluations of where we have been and where God is taking us. It is a time of hope and involvement by all members!! It is a time for prayer and community.

Moved by this poem, I pray that your hearts will be less troubled and full of God's peace...



#### **PASTOR'S REPORT**

- Thanked Redeemer for the \$500 gift and gifts of bedding to "Sleep in Heavenly Peace." This event was a huge success with 84 workers completing 40 bunk beds with 10 others partially completed.
- Led funeral, Holy Week, Easter, and Confirmation services. Redeemer Confirmation May 15. Thanked those who helped to prepare for these services.
- Made homebound visits and phone calls.
- Led Wednesday and Thursday Bible studies.
- Marriage planning for Minniecheskie and Draska wedding 7-2-22 in Stevens Point.
- Completed her mileage report.
- Will be attending Synod Assembly May 13-14.
- Announced her retirement and gave council members a copy of her retirement letter that will be going out the week of May 16. Pastor Sharon will be retiring as of August 31, 2022.

- Purchased and gave out carnations on Mother's Day.

#### Synod Assembly Report May 13, 4-9 pm and May 14, 8-5 pm, 2022 Online and at the Best Western Waterfront Hotel & Conference Center-Oshkosh Attended by Pastor Sharon and Gary and Laura Clark

Assembly Firsts...

- First Hybrid Assembly to welcome voting members online and in person.
- First "Prayground" welcoming children intentionally into assembly space.
- First Dinner Church worship where Holy Communion was shared in the context of our evening meal together.

Thank you for the gifts you gave. Funds were raised for over 55 beds donated to the Oshkosh chapter of Sleep in Heavenly Peace. In kind donations of sheets and bedding were given to Oshkosh, Waupaca, and Green Bay chapters of Sleep in Heavenly Peace. Build day integrated over 85 volunteers of all ages who worked to complete 40 beds and made parts for several more.

An offering was collected for the Bishop's Resource Fund and Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services. Continued gifts can still be given online and by mail: 16 Tri-Park Way, Appleton, WI 54914.

The business of the assembly included... Adoption of the 2023 budget.

Compensation guidelines were adopted for the year 2023 and are recommended for congregations as they work to faithfully compensate rostered ministers.

- 5. Diverse Books Support Cross-Cultural Literacy.
- 6. A Memorial Calling for a Just Transition to 50% Reduction in US Greenhouse Gas Emissions by 2030, as amended.


