²⁸ Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth.


He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable.

It has been a blessing to partner with Zion Redeemer Parish over the last six months. Thank you to all of you who participated in the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT). You have provided your leadership and new pastor with insight and direction for what God is calling you to in the next several years. The CAT listed the top 5 priorities for Zion Redeemer. They are:

- Make necessary changes to attract families with children and youth to our parish.
- Develop and implement a comprehensive strategy to reach new people and incorporate them into the life of the church.
- Provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation at every age and stage of life.
- Develop ministries that work toward healing those broken by life circumstances.
- Create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationships (small groups, nurtured friendships, shared meals, etc.)

These are drivers of satisfaction and energy in your parish. By putting intentionality of time and energy into these priorities, they will fuel continued energy and growth. I encourage you to continue to use the CAT as a resource and tool as you discern the next steps together as the gathered people of God.

Thank you to the Transition/Ministry Site Profile Team which consisted of members from Zion and Redeemer congregations. They have worked thoughtfully and prayerfully in the writing and compilation of information for the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP is information about your parish and larger community that a prospective pastor would review before being interviewed by the Call Committee. After the congregations and councils review the MSP it will be submitted to the East Central Synod of Wisconsin for approval. Then the Call Committee will meet with Pastor Asher O'Callaghan, Assistant to the Bishop, for instructions and next steps. Please be patient. The Call Committee process can be slow as a pastor and the Call Committee takes time to prayerfully discern.

Thank you for your partnership with me in ministry. God's blessings as you move forward into the call for mission and ministry.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parish Life

- Parish Life made \$485 from the Charity Rummage Sale and Bake Sale during the May 6th
 Wittenberg Area Rummage Sale weekend. Items left over were donated to Alpha House and the
 Elderon VFW. \$15 was added from the Bazaar fund to make \$500 which will be donated to local
 charities
- Parish Life will plan and construct a float for the Wittenberg Community Days. We will collaborate
 with Zion on this float. We will purchase magnets and have brochures printed to pass out during the
 parade.
- The Bible Study that ended May 7th was attended by 6 participants. Plans are being made to start the Bible Study again when Sunday school begins in the fall.

Synod Assembly 2023

Synod Assembly was different this year: Since the convention center in Oshkosh was sold out and it was too late to book other venues, this year's convention was held in one day at First English Church in Appleton. This meant that delegates had to do a lot of reading and watching videos ahead of time to be prepared. It also cut down time for discussion. Luckily it turned out that many things on the agenda had been discussed at the previous convention.

Reports were concise: While budgetary deficits were low, they were part of a trend as donations continue to be down. With the sale of the former synod building this week, the expenses and accompanying pressure will be going down.

Addresses throughout the convention were given by the leaders of local churches: Roman Catholic, Methodist, Episcopalian, and Presbyterian expressed confidence that, yes, we all have the same boss and we can work together.

Elections were held for synod positions: Elected were Rev. David Mannoja, Synod council, Green Bay conference; Rev. Crystal Lee, Synod Council, Oshkosh Conference; Rev. Paul Johnson, Synod Council, Shawano Conference (Church of the Wilderness); Paula Vandergriten, Discipline Committee, Green Bay Conference; David Leder, Discipline Committee, Tomorrow River Conference; Pam Pfaff, Consultation Committee, Oshkosh Conference; Connie Eisch, Consultation Committee, Tomorrow River Conference. Five positions are unfilled, including two from the Shawano Area Conference, that will be filled by appointment. If you are interested in either the Synod Council or the Consultation Committee, please contact the Synod Office.

A budgetary revision was passed that the endowment committee is to handle any property that comes to the synod, such as proceeds from the sale of property like the sale of the former synod office and property from churches that have closed, and any gift of property. Funds are to be distributed in accordance with the spending plan and in concurrence with the Synod Council.

Resolutions were about helping humanity go forward in accordance with Christian values; to encourage Land Acknowledgements of Native American tribes, to educate members to be Advocates in Preventing Hunger, and Action to End Racism. All resolutions were passed.

Even under uncomfortable quarters, the delegates were congenial and the staff welcoming. It was wonderful having discussions that were polite and respectful.

I have also included a form for a letter to send to Senator Johnson and Senator Baldwin concerning hunger in the world. If you have time, please write to them concerning this important issue.

Laura and I thank you for this opportunity to represent our church at the assembly. It was an honor and a privilege! Thank you!

Dear Senator Johnson,

The farm bill is our nation's most important national food system legislation. It is critical to the work of ending hunger at home and abroad. Indeed, the farm bill impacts each one of us.

As Congress works to renew our food and farm programs through the farm bill, I urge you to support legislation that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.

Specifically, I ask you to:

- Increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables by increasing support for produce specific Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (GusNIP), which provides resources on top of monthly SNAP benefits for a limited number of households to use towards the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables primarily at farmers' markets.
- Eliminate barriers to SNAP for marginalized populations. For example, end the ban on former drug offenders, eliminate work requirements for college students, and permit indigenous communities to administer SNAP and other federal nutrition programs on reservations.
- Keep food out of landfills by increasing support for post-harvest food recovery efforts and addressing the threat to food security posed by extreme weather.
- Support funding for international food aid programs such as Food for Peace. As a person of faith, I
 am moved to help and advocate for people experiencing hunger and poverty—no matter where
 they live. This is why I urge you to support a farm bill that builds healthy, equitable, and
 sustainable food systems.


