Love Your Neighbor excerpts from Our Daily Bread (odb.org), July 2023

It was just a fun game at youth group, but it held a lesson for us: rather than switching neighbors, learn to love the ones you have. Everyone is seated in a large circle, except for one person who stands in the middle of the circle. The standing person asks someone sitting down, "Do you love your neighbor?" The seated person can answer the question in two ways: yes or no.

- 1. Designate a person to be lt.
- 2. Have everyone else sit in chairs in a circle around It. There should not be any empty chairs.
- 3. It approaches someone sitting in a chair and asks "Do you love your neighbor?"
- 4. If the person answers "Yes I love my neighbor" then the people sitting to the left and right of that person must switch places. It may try to take one of their seats.
- 5. If the person answers "No" they must also add "but I love everyone who _____has a sister or is wearing red or has a pet, etc.". Everyone who meets that criterion must get up and find a new place to sit. It may try to steal of their seats.
- 6. Whoever doesn't have a seat is It and play continues.

Don't we wish we could choose our "neighbors" in real life too? Especially when we have a colleague whom we can't get along with or a next-door neighbor who loves to mow the lawn at odd hours. More often than not, however, we have to learn to live with our difficult neighbors.

When the Israelites moved into the promised land, God gave them important instructions on how to live as people who belonged to Him. They're told to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18), which includes not spreading gossip or rumors, not taking advantage of our neighbors, and confronting people directly if we have something against them (vv. 9-18).

While it's difficult to love everyone, it's possible to treat others in loving ways as Jesus works in and through us. God will supply the wisdom and ability to do so as we seek to live our identity as His people. *POH FANG CHIA*

Who are the "neighbors" you find hard to get along with? How can you love them better?

Father, help me to reflect Your love to those around me—even the difficult ones.

Insight: Leviticus 19 contains the only Old Testament reference to "love your neighbor as yourself" (v. 18), a fundamental teaching in the Bible. In the New Testament, when an expert in the law asked, "What is the greatest commandment in the Law?" (Matthew 22:36), Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." And he continued, "The second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Paul said the commandments are "summed up in this one command" and are "fulfilled in keeping it." Our love for God is evidenced in our loving treatment of our neighbors. *ALYSON KIEDA*

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parish Life

- Kim Timm presented the \$250 check to Waypost from proceeds from the rummage sale, and Mary Mattes will do the same for the food pantry. Pictures will be posted on Facebook and the website.
- Parish Life will plan and construct a float for the Wittenberg Community Days. We will collaborate with Zion on this float. We have purchased magnets and have brochures printed to pass out during the parade. Brianna Schmidt will sing on the float using our new sound system.
- A joint Zion/Redeemer church service and picnic is being planned for June 25th at Washington Park in Wittenberg. There is a sign-up sheet for food on the bulletin board. Redeemer will provide the main course. It was voted to have Hula Hut pulled pork. Money for this will be taken from Thrivent Choice Dollars.

Strong Bodies Program


