Get this: You are ALREADY loved by God. No conditions. No qualifications. No ifs, ands, or buts about it. You are ALREADY a beloved child of God.

In the church world we have a word for this love – we call it *grace*.

Grace Defined

The bible is a great starting point for better understanding what grace is all about. According to New Testament lexicographer, Dr. Spiros Zodhiates (and with a name like that you know he means business!) grace is:

...that which causes joy, pleasure, gratification, favor and acceptance. A favor done without any expectation of return, the absolute free expression of the love of God finding its only motive in the bounty and benevolence of the giver... It changes the individual to a new creature...

In other words, grace is a no-strings-attached gift of love given to us by God that we may be transformed and made new.

The Foundational Christian Experience

The experience of grace is the foundational Christian experience. It's both the starting point of faith and the thing that keeps even seasoned Christians walking in the way of Jesus.

What is this experience like?

It's like being met with a hug when you expected to be locked out of the house. It's like being told you're forgiven when you know the thing you did was totally unforgivable. It's like being crushed with debt and living paycheck to paycheck only to be told you no longer owe a thing.

The experience of grace is like all that and more. Over the millennia much ink has been spilt trying to capture its breadth and depth, and yet theologians have yet to find its limits. But one thing is for sure: the experience of this embracing, forgiving, debt-relieving love is where the Christian journey begins.

Call Committee & Joint Zion/Redeemer Council Meeting

August 6, 2023

Meeting called to order at 3:40 by Zion President Gary Thompson (since Pastor Asher was a no-show and didn't answer his phone.) There was discussion about what our next steps will be in order to fill our pastoral vacancy. Linda Evje was commended for doing a great job getting substitute pastors. Kim Timm said that the Ministry Site Profile clearly stated that we are willing to work with someone who wants a part-time position-whether it be as Director of Waypost Camp or some other job since we can't pay for a full-time pastor at \$120,000 a year.

Pete Krolow listed three points of action that our Zion/Redeemer Parish could take.

1. Contact the Synod for a full list of ordained pastors in our area willing to work part-time.
2. Get a list of SAM candidates in our area. [Synod Authorized Minister (SAM): In situations where an ELCA ordained minister is unavailable to serve the sacrament of Holy Communion in a congregation for extended periods of time, a lay member may be authorized by the bishop to serve and administer the sacrament of Holy Communion to fulfill the bishop's authority to provide for 'appropriate pastoral leadership'. The office of the bishop will work closely with a congregation if this option is to be considered. The SAM candidate will attend Lay Ministry School and continue to take annual courses in ministry.]
3. Determine if there are any Lay Ministers in our congregations who are interested in enrolling in the SAM program. (Pete Krolow said he was interested, but had some concerns on the rules, such as not being able to attend his church after retirement if he served at that church or to be buried at that church.)

A motion was made by Kim Timm, seconded by Don Nelson to authorize the council presidents to contact Bishop Anne and present the above three points of action. The motion passed unanimously. Her contact email is: bishopanne@ecsw.org and phone for call or text: 920-903-9679.
