The East-Central Synod of Wisconsin recently hired Ben Stepanek to be the communications manager for the synod. Ben's primary task is to share news about the synod and its activities with pastors, congregations, and the larger community. At the synod council's quarterly meeting in January, Ben asked council about the success of the synod's communication in the past. Among the responses came this insightful comment from a pastor in Wausau, "We are not suffering from a lack of information. We are suffering from a lack of interest."

We live in an age where many have lost interest in organized religion. These are the "spiritual, but not religious" group. Others are only half-interested. Perhaps they attend worship occasionally. Perhaps they send their children to Christian education, but find little value in attending worship or engaging in activities at church themselves.

It seems the local church is no longer interesting, or not as interesting as some of the other things seeking our time and attention. This reality is one of the reasons Redeemer is discussing the benefits of parish model ministry with other churches in our area. Redeemer is negatively impacted by a lack of interest. What about our community?

Disinterest in the local church has a ripple effect in the community. I recently read an article that asserts, when we choose to have less connection to and less interaction with people and organizations who can lift us up, who can help us out, and who are always there for us, a certain way of life disappears. Churches, historically, provide vital social services to community members. When churches face a decline in resources, problems develop, or get worse, in the surrounding community. For example, looking at Redeemer's budget, we see our annual contribution to The Wittenberg Food Pantry dropped from \$1,000 in 2018 to \$500 this year. To adapt to our financial reality, Redeemer has decreased the positive impact we can make in the lives of those who are hungry in our community. Can you think of other ways Redeemer's declining resources impacts Wittenberg?

We are not suffering from a lack of information in this day and age. We are suffering from a lack of interest. In light of this, I wonder what keeps you interested in being active at Redeemer. What keeps you interested in attending worship, bringing youth to Sunday School and Confirmation instruction, going to a Bible study, giving an offering, and attending a fellowship events? What keeps you interested in growing in your relationship with Jesus and living out your faith day after day? I welcome your feedback.

Parish Model Ministry - Exploration Task Force Update

The members of the task force are: Arla Block, Ryan Buntrock, Makenna Dombeck, Tracy Dombeck, Rick Froom, Shondel Hansen, Ann Hawley, Gail Koehler, Miriam Nelson, and Dan Weisensel.

The purpose of the task force is to think creatively, imagine, and explore the needs of Redeemer and the possibilities of collaborative ministry in a Parish Model, with one or more of the seven churches in our geographical area - Arbutus, Antigo (2), Aniwa (2), and Birnamwood (2).

The task force met on January 10 to go over individual responses to the following statements:

This is how we would describe our congregation's sense of purpose.

This is how working collaboratively with other congregations would help us achieve that purpose more effectively.

This is what we have to offer potential ministry partners.

This is what we are looking for from potential ministry partners.

From each member's individual responses a group response was recorded. If you would like to read the task forces' group response, please see Pastor Amy.

Pastor Amy, Arla Block, and Ann Hawley took Redeemer's group response to a meeting held on Jan. 27 in Antigo. Bishop Mansholt, Pr. Amy Engebose, Pr. Jean Devoll-Donaldson, Ben Stepanek and representatives of the seven churches attended to discuss each congregation's responses to the questions we were given. The other congregations' responses were very similar to Redeemer's for all the statements.

We collectively discussed the benefits and risks of Parish Model Ministry. Benefits include access to more ideas, people, and outreach opportunities; sharing financial resources; more consistent/better access to pastoral leadership; and building new relationships. Risks include change, the loss of individual congregational identity, potential loss of members, and geography/miles between churches. In reference to the scary thought of losing a congregation's individual identity, the group was assured that the Parish Model seeks to keep the rich histories and traditions of each congregation alive by creating a covenant among partnering congregations and a governing board for the parish comprised of representatives from all member churches.

Finally, we assessed our congregation's comfort level of involvement on a continuum from *Cooperation* (All church resources are separate; Share a leader(s).) to *Coordination* (Resources are partially pooled; Share a leader(s) and some programming.) to *Collaboration* (Resources are pooled; Share a leader(s), programming, and common mission.) Those of us from Redeemer believe Redeemer is on the continuum somewhere to the right of *Coordination*, but not yet ready for *Collaboration*.
