Hello Redeemer friends, my partners in the Gospel!

John opens his Gospel, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." (Vs10) This Word has been with us from the beginning of time and continues to be the truth beyond time as we currently know it. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (Vs. 5) Although Zion and I are new to you, we have been joined long before this partnership became a reality. Chosen in our baptism we are called to this light. We celebrate this word made flesh, this light among us, this God who is with us through thick and thin! I look forward to the adventure ahead. We can begin by sharing our stories about how we are drawn to this light, about who God has made us to be, and about where we imagine God is calling us in 2020.

Amazing relationships, not all easy or perfect, but by the grace of God, full of forgiveness, tears and laughter, faith and growth. Time to discover God at work in us, individually and as the body of Christ! Now you and I, Redeemer, are given

this privilege to partner in faith!

My first job took me to Sheboygan as a Recreation Supervisor where I got paid for playing: fitness, volleyball, basketball, swimming, playgrounds, afterschool programs, senior citizen clubs. As your pastor, I support all these God-given activities and relationships; it is good to care for your body and for your relationships. It's a balancing act to keep family and worship life a top priority! Will you support me in doing so, even as I encourage you? I am always up for a walk and talk!

You will soon get to meet my Norwegian/Swedish husband Phil. He is an ELCA pastor of 27 years, former US forester, avid golfer and all-around good guy. We have 2 sons, Aaron, a music geek/DJ in St Paul, MN and Adam, a new graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College who is enjoying working at the Seward Food Coop in Minneapolis, MN. He's an outdoors, "go green", make a light footprint on the earth, activist. Grateful to God for my family!

Grateful also for you, my new church family! Let's be gentle on each other as we take time to hear each other's stories and to look for God's light in the center. Beginnings are precious, a time to be gentle, patient and honest with each other, time to look for each other's giftedness, time to get real and share our questions and convictions. #### TREASURER'S REPORT

Peggy submitted the Treasurer's report showing an account balance of \$166,859.99 as of December 31, 2019. Of that amount, \$38,522.93 was budget funds and \$128,337.06 was non-budget funds. (\$85,000 of the non-budget funds includes money received for the parsonage.) Investment Report: Christian Education Fund balance \$65,135.54 and Larson Fund balance \$37,296.52. Cemetery Funds \$65,286.96.

#### **Greater Wausau Christian Services**

<u>Hebrews 13:3</u> Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them, and those who are mistreated, since you also are in the body.

**Psalm 69:33** For the Lord hears the needy and does not despise his own people who are prisoners. **Psalm 34:18** The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.

Greater Wausau Christian Services is a non-profit organization supported by ten area churches (mostly Lutheran). Its purpose is to bring the basic gospel message to those in need. Currently about two-hundred fifty people a month are ministered to through Bible studies at the Marathon County Jail, the Juvenile Delinquency Center, and major nursing homes in the Wausau area. Upon request, bibles are provided at no cost to the inmates at the County Jail and Delinquency Center. Each of the Life Recovery Bibles cost \$15 with about 30 given out monthly. Area pastors, lay pastors, and lay people volunteer to do the bible studies for Greater Wausau Christian Services, so the basic expenses are the salary for the director, Ray Slatton (who is also the county jail chaplain) and the cost of the bibles.

Greater Wausau Christian Services helped to found "Open Door" which provides donated interview clothes, family support group meetings, and educational services to those recently released from jail. It is located in the back of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, downtown Wausau.

Kid's Kount is another program supported by Greater Wausau Christian Services. Kid's Kount collects gifts for children of those incarcerated in the Marathon County Jail at Christmas time-over fifty this year.

My brother-in-law, Richard Hawley, is a lay pastor and the representative from Trinity Lutheran Church in Stettin (where Pastor Phil Bogen is the minister) for Greater Wausau Christian Services. He states, "I have done a bible study in the county jail for the last nine years. There are people in the jail looking for hope, a second chance and meaning in their lives. God's word provides that hope-an anchor in their lives when all seems lost. I hope that Redeemer Lutheran will join GWCS in our effort to bring God's love to those in need."

I know there are many worthwhile organizations that would appreciate our donations. This one is near to my heart because of the stories that my brother-in-law has told me about encounters with those incarcerated. They do so much for a forgotten segment of society. If you feel moved to make a donation, you can make a check out to Redeemer "for" Greater Wausau Christian Services. I will match any donations given in the month of February up to a total of \$125 (so the goal is \$250).
