This is the daily e-mail devotion from the Henri Nouwen Society dated January 1, 2019, entitled "A New Beginning."

We must learn to live each day, each hour, yes, each minute as a new beginning, as a unique opportunity to make everything new. Imagine that we could live each moment as a moment pregnant with new life. Imagine that we could live each day as a day full of promises. Imagine that we could walk through the new year always listening to the voice saying to us: "I have a gift for you and can't wait for you to see it!" Imagine.

Is it possible that our imagination can lead us to the truth of our lives? Yes, it can! The problem is that we allow our past, which becomes longer and longer each year, to say to us: "You know it all; you have seen it all, be realistic; the future will just be a repeat of the past. Try to survive it as best you can." There are many cunning foxes jumping on our shoulders and whispering in our ears the great lie: "There is nothing new under the sun... don't let yourself be fooled."

When we listen to these foxes, they eventually prove themselves right: our new year, our new day, our new hour become flat, boring, dull, and without anything new.

So what are we to do? First, we must send the foxes back to where they belong: in their foxholes. And then we must open our minds and our hearts to the voice that resounds through the valleys and hills of our life saying: "Let me show you where I live among my people. My name is 'God-with-you.' I will wipe all the tears from your eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. The world of the past has gone" (Revelation 21:2–5).

This meditation was too good for me to not share it with you. Imagine the possibilities!

#### What Worship Does for Kids By Peggy Nelson

Parents typically spend hundreds of dollars on extracurricular activities for their children. Money spent on training in martial arts is considered an investment in children's safety. Private tutoring is often purchased for a child struggling academically. It is quite average for a family to spend \$9,076 yearly on expenditures for three youth participating in sports.

We need to invest in our children's spiritually.

One way to invest in our children's spiritually is by advancing what I call their "worship training." Participation in worship training is a major component to a child's spiritual development and well-being. I consider this second in importance only to helping them obtain assurance of their salvation. The author has four practical applications of worship training, both at home and in children's ministry, and how they can benefit children. Two of the four are highlighted below:

**1. Worship helps kids in their spiritual walk.** Children who experience true worship grow in their personal relationship with God as they learn to put their trust in God and to be led by His Spirit. Children who are given the opportunity to worship God both publicly and privately will be less stressed and more able to deal with negative emotions.

Children who worship on a regular basis will develop hearts filled with gratefulness as they recognize God's goodness and mercy. They will be much more able to extend those graces toward others.

2. Worship ushers peace into their environment. Worship can be a wonderful avenue to release peace into an environment, whether it is the church or home setting. Encourage parents to play worship music before bedtime, or sing songs they've learned in Sunday School together. Especially for those children who have difficulty falling asleep or who struggle with fearful dreams, religious music can usher peace into their hearts and home.
