FREEDOM FROM? FREEDOM FOR?

I love the 4th of July! I love celebrating America with community parades and family gatherings - all ending up in fireworks lighting the night sky! I am proud of our flag and the USA! Independence Day we remember precious freedoms, all too often, take for granted: freedom of speech and religion, freedom to feel safe on our streets, to drink clean water, to travel easily across state borders. Tragically, not everyone in the world or in America has access to good education and health care, travel, electricity, postal service, and garbage pick-up. In 2014, our 16-year-old exchange student Izzeddin, from Palestine, taught us to appreciate the freedoms which we have, many of which his country does not have.

This past week Izzeddin called to share his joy of getting engaged. We saw pictures of Ruba and heard about their process of engagement and marriage. The families are very involved. But due to Covid numbers, with very few vaccinations available and increased political unrest, the two families were not free to travel safely to see each other and together give a customary approval. Finally, wedding plans are in the making and engagement dating can progress. Our phone conversation then turned to talk of the lack of freedoms for Palestinians, especially for males near Izzeddin's age 23. When he travels, he is stopped 2-3 times at check points where he is searched and regularly feels a gun pointed at his head. He often fears for his life, for his beautiful future as a husband, father, and musician! It was heartbreaking to hear. Throughout his life Izzeddin has seen too many of his people shot on the streets in random skirmishes. We felt his pain as he told the story of watching a 9-year-old girl being shot and killed for no apparent reason! Please keep the people of Palestine and Israel in prayer!

Freedom is messed up in his world, and if we are honest, in our America as well. Izzeddin does not live as freely as we do. Nor does every American citizen have every freedom promised, especially those people who have a faith or skin color like Izzeddin. Such discrepancy breaks my heart! I am a Christian living in a country that was built on Christianity, built on the concept of "freedom for all!". But too many Americans are afraid on our streets. Too many do not have clean water or the life privileges for which we all hope. Endangered lives in a "free" country. Maybe it's time for "Interdependence Day"!

The Bible has lots to say about freedom, so does Jesus, so does Martin Luther! Love your neighbor as yourself. Do onto others as you would have them do onto you. Walk humbly with God showing justice and mercy. In Christ there is a new creation. Everything old has passed away. For freedom Christ has set us free! Martin Luther says, "Freed from bondage to sin; freed for service to all!" Beautiful instructions but so difficult to live out as individuals and as a country. Americans claim "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness"; but not all find it to be true.

Thank God, Jesus died and rose for this very reason! On our own, we try too hard to make freedom our own to give. But Jesus challenges the ways of the world. It is not our great faith or our pious efforts that save ourselves or others. Jesus' death and resurrection point us to a new way of life... **freedom from** that weight of being the best person or the most powerful country who knows all the answers. This way of life separates us from God and from each other. But Jesus shows us that we are not alone, that the whole world is loved by God that God's abundance is meant for sharing. Thus, we are **freed for loving relationships, freed for** living with open hearts. There is more than enough of God's goodness to go around. As Christians, we are **freed for** generosity, honesty, respect, and forgiveness.

This is costly grace, paid at a great price so that all can live. Christians, we must not cheapen the cross!! Let this freedom ring, dear followers of Jesus, not only for fellow Americans, or for fellow Christians, but for all of creation!

As we lived with Izzeddin for 10 months, we learned a lot about each other. Cultural traditions and family habits define who we are, but they also are part of what made connecting with each other such hard work. Understanding came, but not without a lot of give and take. We regularly slipped up and offended the other person. Without forgiveness and fresh new starts we would not have grown, perhaps would never have loved!

What drove us beyond our own ways was the growing ability to take an interest in the other's ways. This often cost us our own pride and arrogance. We had to step out of our own needs and desires and put someone else first. There were numerous conversations to figure out why one of us was hurt and what we had to say "I'm sorry" for. Almost daily we had to start anew. Over time, love grew with these shared experiences.

Love grew out of allowing each other to be our real, unpredictable selves. We became gifts to each other by God's design...we were surprised by God's grace!

May the God of Jacob and Abraham, Sarah and Hagar continue to show us who we are: beloved children of God, meant to be in healthy and loving relationships. **Set free from the trap of being turned inward to the freedom for turning toward each other**. God be with you, dear Izzeddin, Ruba, your families, and your country. May God bless America and all the nations of the world! Trusting that God will bless each of us disciples at Redeemer/Zion Lutheran Parish! Ultimately freedom is a gift from God! It is for giving away!!!! For all to be free and come to know LOVE!

NEW BUSINESS


- A/C in the church has been installed.
