Dear Friends,

Hala is a 37-year-old mother of four young children and a refugee from Sudan living in Cairo, Egypt. Hala's husband died when COVID-19 first hit Africa, and she was left to support her four children alone. COVID-19 safety measures had temporarily closed many of the nongovernmental organizations that normally support refugees. Without her husband's income, Hala couldn't afford rent, and she and her young children risked eviction.

Thankfully, St. Andrew's Refugee Services (StARS) – supported by ELCA World Hunger – continued its work during the early days of the pandemic. Hala reached out to one of the community-based organizations StARS supports and was connected to a caseworker, who helped her get an emergency grant to cover her rent for the next month and resources to find a job.

When you donate to ELCA World Hunger, you support programs such as this one that help people during times of crisis. This is one pillar of our shared work as church to end hunger and poverty in nearly 60 countries around the world, including in the United States. Your gifts fund programs focusing on education; health, water and sanitation; agriculture and nutrition; income and savings; peace, justice and human rights; and advocacy and community organizing. This is part of Jesus Christ's call on our church. And to answer the call, we need you.

Summary of ELCA Churchwide Synod Assembly Report 2020 -21

Pastor Sharon, Gary and Laura Clark attended via Zoom. Bishop Anne Edison-Albright and VP Bill Horne came across loud and clear; others were difficult to hear. These two reports made my heart sing about the leadership and work of our larger church during this Covid Year. Your prayers and financial support are making a difference here, in our nation, and world!

Our congregations in the East Central Synod of WI gave \$674,832.

Our congregations across the USA gave \$40,739,221.

Like us and all congregations this past year, our leadership in Chicago had to think out of the box. They decided to help pastors and other leaders by raising more funds - \$1,8 million - which served 400,000 people. This funded 830 ministries, some right here. My salary and custodians' paychecks at both Zion and Redeemer were covered for several months. Church of the Wilderness and Crossways Camping Ministry benefitted along with Pilgrim in Wausau for their Domestic Hunger Program.

Here is how we made a difference in the world: Lutheran Disaster Relief was there aiding 49 countries; seminaries were given \$2.8 million to train much needed pastors. The ELCA supports missionaries in Kenya, Tanzania, Japan, South Africa. Our ELCA is deeply involved with hunger advocacy and education around the world (14% hungry) and around the corner (1 out of 4 children in the USA). Your donations provide food and other resources: medical needs, shelter, access to clean water, sustainable agriculture, livestock, loans for women to work or start a business, medical care, and education with it all! We can all be proud of this mission work.

The High School Youth Gathering is set for July 24-28, 2022 in Minneapolis. The theme is "Boundless – God Beyond Measure" I would love to go with a group from our Parish. It is incredible worshiping with 20,000 voices, listening to speakers who inspire youth, and witnessing the faith of teens come alive! Who wants to be a chaperone with me?

ARLA, LOIS & ANN LAY MINISTRY GRADUATES!!!

Summary of Lay Ministry School June, 2021

Thank you to the congregation for sponsoring us (Arla Block, Lois Anderson, and Ann Hawley) for two years so we could attend the East Central Synod of Wisconsin Lay School of Ministry. We learned so much and feel more confident in our abilities to lead services and/or teach Sunday School. (The cost is \$525/year for the core classes including the books.)

Classes were held Friday evening and Saturday morning one weekend a month from September through May. This year classes met virtually using Zoom. Next year there will be a virtual option, but we all agreed that we liked meeting in person at St. Andrew Church in Wausau better, so hopefully that will be available too.

Last year's courses were 1) Old Testament, 2) Systematic Theology, 3) Liturgy and Life, and 4) Faith and Spirituality. This year's courses were 1) New Testament, 2) Lutheran Confessions, 3) Faith and Spirituality, and 4) Church History. Continuing education courses are also offered. According to their website, the subject of these courses often encompass more timely events or dive deeper in conversations that students are pondering. Students are not required to have completed the core classes to participate in the continuing education courses. These courses vary from year to year. This year they were 1) Liberation Theology (a movement that looks at the good news through the lens of the least, the marginalized, the exploited, the oppressed); 2) Christ at the Center (explore the Hebrew Bible-upon which the Old Testament is based, and show how these writers were preparing people for the coming of Christ); 3) A Return from Exile-Marks of the Church in a Pandemic Age (what the new normal will look like: in-person and virtual); and 4) Homiletics: Preaching and Practice (crafting a faithful, inspirational sermon). The cost is \$100 per class or all four for \$300.

If interested in attending Lay Ministry School check out their website (www.ecswLaySchool.org) or ask Arla, Lois or Ann. It would really be beneficial for your own personal knowledge and for our congregation.

Personal Reflections:

Ann-I enjoyed the monthly readings and the in-depth discussions. One of the things on my "bucket list" was to read the entire Bible, and I did it because of Lay Ministry School!

Lois-I also enjoyed the monthly readings. It was an opportunity to see things I thought I knew about in a new, in-depth perspective. I particularly liked the Old and New Testament courses, the Faith and Spirituality courses and Liturgy and Life.

Arla-I enjoyed the study of the Old and New Testament especially the discussions that went beyond actual fact as some words are symbols of what they describe. I enjoyed the fellowship when we were able to meet in person the first year. Having class via "zoom" was necessary but not as rewarding.

Next Council meeting, Thursday, June 10 at 5:30pm.


The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Motion made by Linda Evje, seconded by Kim Timm, to adjourn. Carried.
