

Motion made by Paul Pehlke, seconded by Maribeth Netzler, to approve the July 2019 Meeting Minutes. Carried.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

Peggy submitted the Treasurer's report showing an account balance of \$34,106.86 as of July 31, 2019. Of that amount, \$12,487.68 was budget funds and \$21,619.18 was non-budget funds.

Motion by Paul Pehlke, seconded by Faith Kristof, to approve the August bills as presented. Carried.

Peggy noted we are currently operating under budget due to the temporary elimination of Pastor salary/expenses, however, the Substitute Pastor Budget will be over budget this year due to our unforeseen need of Substitute Pastors. Our regular offerings are lower than last year at this time.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

#### Parish Life

- -Working on getting Bazaar set-up. This will be on October 12, 2019. It will once again be a joint event with Holy Family, St. Paul's and possibly Alpha House.
- -Rally Day is September 8<sup>th</sup>. Services will be at 10:00 starting this day.

### **Parish Education**

- -Next meeting August 21
- -VBS will be this week August 13-15. Everything is set.
- -Sunday School begins September 8 at 8:45am
- -Laura Clark will be doing confirmation classes.

### Worship/Music/Arts

- -Met last week to plan music for the next couple of months
- -Faith spoke with Faith, Hope, and Harmony regarding providing special music during a service. They are booked out until the middle of October. Redeemer would be charged \$400 if we are interested in booking them.

A motion was made by Paul Pehlke, seconded by Joy Hartleben, to authorize Faith Kristof to book Faith, Hope, and Harmony for service on either October 20 or 27 at the cost of \$400. Motion Carried.

Discussion was had regarding putting out a Free Will Donation Basket to help cover this expense.

### **Trustees**

- -Elevator: Otis has switched leadership changing the maintenance schedule. Due to a conflict of interest Otis can no longer inspect and maintain the elevator, therefore, Mimi will be doing inspections and Otis will be doing any maintenance or repairs.

  -Parsonage: Joel Hartleben cleaned the gutters and cleared some brush. Thank you Joel! Due to the water damage an Insurance Inspector came to assess any possible coverage. They noted repairs that needed to be done and now need contractor estimates for the roof work and drywall replacing in the living room, family room, and kitchen. Before going to the congregation to request any money to be put toward repair/updating the parsonage, council would like to get an estimate on the value of the property as it sits now. This will be needed before any decision is made on the future of the parsonage as well\*. It was noted that someone has already approached one of our congregational members with interest in buying the parsonage as is.
- \*A future special congregational meeting will be held to determine the future of the parsonage once council has gathered information and options that can be presented.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Arise Campaign-Christian Education Fund Gift-Tabled

Parish Model Ministry: We are hoping to get more information during the meeting with the Bishop on Wednesday, August 14, as to options our church can explore.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

There are 3 parishioners (Arla Block, Ann Hawley, and Lois Anderson) interested in pursuing continued education in Lay Ministry. This requires taking courses for 2 years for certification at a cost of \$525 per person per year. Classes begin in September.

Motion made by Peggy Emmel, seconded by Mary Peterson, for Redeemer to cover the cost of Lay Ministry Certification for the next two years for Arla Block, Ann Hawley, and Lois Anderson at a cost of \$1,575 per year. Motion carried.

Council feels that having certified Lay Members will be a huge benefit to our church. If there are any other members interested in Lay Ministry Certification in the future, please contact a council member.

The Synod Companion Relationship with the Moretele Circuit from South Africa is looking for housing hosts for members that will be coming to our area in June 2020. Information will be posted on the church bulletin board. They would like to find host families by September 15<sup>th</sup>. Please contact a council member if you are interested.

Next Council meeting, Sunday, September 8th after the 10:00 service.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Motion made by Paul Pehlke, seconded by Mary Peterson, to adjourn. Carried.

Dear Members of the Shawano Conference

A companionship trip is being planned for the summer of 2020 for people from the Moretele Circuit to come to our conference. It is time to start making some plans with the following information.

- 1. Our congregations are being asked how many visitors that they would like to host.
- 2. The focus of their visit to us will not be as much to entertain our visitors, but to spend time together in daily life and build relationships.

Questions to be answered by each church (council or congregation) with response requested by September 15<sup>th</sup>:

- 1. Will this congregation be willing to host visitors from their companion parish in the Moretele Circuit in South Africa between June 17<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020, depending upon air flights?
- 2. If so, how many people? (It is suggested that congregations consider hosting from 2-6 visitors. More than six may create transportation challenges).
- 3. As soon as possible and before September 15 if possible, please complete the Letter of Invitation and return it to Pastor Lois Graper. Contact information: PO Box 123, Tilleda WI 54978 <a href="https://linear.org/length-len

Additional notes to consider in hosting:

- 1. Churches that agree to host will provide food, shelter and transportation while the visitors are here. Yet to be determined is how the cost of transportation from an airport to our conference will be arranged.
- 2. Churches that want to host visitors will be encouraged to have the overnight hosts attend at least one conference/synod orientation session.
- 3. It is recommended that visitors be able to stay with a host for three or more days before moving to another place. Constant change is confusing and wearing for anyone traveling. During the day the visitors may visit with groups or individuals around a meal or an event.
- 4. It would be helpful to develop intentional times of conversation with the visitors to host congregations. These conversations are to share insights on faith, worship, prayer, stewardship and other areas of faith and ministry with each other. The planning team will be preparing questions to prompt conversations around faith topics.
- 5. At the orientation such topics as gifts (from individuals and from congregations) will be discussed.
- 6. At the orientation there will be topics addressed that include assumptions that may be made both by our visitors and by ourselves.
